

- To intinct (dip) your wafer into the wine, hold it between your thumb and forefinger.
- Once the chalices have passed, exit out the side and back down the side aisles to your pew.

Gluten free wafers are available, simply let the priest know you require one. If you prefer not to receive the bread or wine but would like a blessing, gently cross your arms across your chest.

A standing station is also available in front of the pulpit.

# The Feast of All Saints - Sunday, November 3

Today is our celebration of All Saints. The Feast of All Saints and the Feast of All Souls are closely connected. At All Saints', we celebrate the lives of the saints who have gone before us and take lessons from their lives of faith and devotion. At All Souls', we honor the lives of those we have lost, especially those who have passed within the last year. It's a yearly celebration of those who have shared life with us who we can no longer see, and whose life and memories continue to impact who we are. All Saints' is one of the feast days particularly appropriate for the sacrament of baptism, as those who enter into the Christian faith gather in the witness of all the saints who have gone before.
