THE FIRST LESSON Genesis 18:20-32

THE LORD said to Abraham, "How great is the outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah and how very grave their sin! I must go down and see whether they have done altogether according to the outcry that has come to me; and if not, I will know." So the men turned from there, and went toward Sodom, while Abraham remained standing before the LORD. Then Abraham came near and said, "Will you indeed sweep away the righteous with the wicked? Suppose there are fifty righteous within the city; will you then sweep away the place and not forgive it for the fifty righteous who are in it? Far be it from you to do such a thing, to slay the righteous with the wicked, so that the righteous fare as the wicked! Far be that from you! Shall not the Judge of all the earth do what is just?" And the LORD said, "If I find at Sodom fifty righteous in the city, I will

forgive the whole place for their sake." Abraham answered, "Let me take it upon myself to speak to the Lord, I who am but dust and ashes. Suppose five of the fifty righteous are lacking? Will you destroy the whole city for lack of five?" And he said, "I will not destroy it if I find forty-five there." Again he spoke to him, "Suppose forty are found there." He answered, "For the sake of forty I will not do it." Then he said, "Oh do not let the Lord be angry if I speak. Suppose thirty are found there." He answered, "I will not do it, if I find thirty there." He said, "Let me take it upon myself to speak to the Lord. Suppose twenty are found there." He answered, "For the sake of twenty I will not destroy it." Then he said, "Oh do not let the Lord be angry if I speak just once more. Suppose ten are found there." He answered, "For the sake of ten I will not destroy it."

THE SECOND LESSON Colossians 2:6-15

As you have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving. See to it that no one takes you captive through philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the universe, and not according to Christ. For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, and you have come to fullness in him, who is the head of every ruler and authority. In him also you were circumcised with a spiritual circumcision, by putting off the body of the flesh in the circumcision of Christ; when you were buried with him in baptism, you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead. And when you were dead in trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive together with him, when he forgave us all our trespasses, erasing the record that stood against us with its legal demands. He set this aside, nailing it to the cross. He disarmed the rulers and authorities and made a public example of them, triumphing over them in it.

### THE NICENE CREED

p. 358

### **INVITATION TO COMMUNION**

#### Communion at Christ & St. Luke's:

- At the indication of the usher, please move to the center aisle and proceed up the altar rail. Move to the open spot filling in from the center of the rail to the wall.
- Kneel as you are able and place one hand over the other, palms up, to receive the bread.
- To sip from a chalice to receive the wine, consume the bread leaving your palms empty.
- To intinct (dip) your wafer into the wine, hold it between your thumb and forefinger.
- Once the chalices have passed, exit out the side and back down the side aisles to your pew.

Gluten free wafers are available, simply let the priest know you require one. If you prefer not to receive the bread or wine but would like a blessing, gently cross your arms across your chest.

A standing station is also available in front of the pulpit.

### **MUSIC NOTES**

Music notes: Today we welcome organist Dr. Carl Haywood and vocalist DeVonté Saunders who are leading our worship today while our Choir and Pilgrims are in England. We thank them for their gifts of beautiful and inspiring music in our worship. Today the Choir sings their final services at Canterbury Cathedral and tomorrow they move to London to begin their week-long residency at St. Paul's Cathedral.

Our guest soloist today is DeVonté Saunders, tenor, who studied at Virginia Commonwealth University and was featured in the debut of Loving Versus Virginia by acclaimed composer Damien Geter with the Virginia Opera. At the Offertory, he sings the well-known aria "If With All Your Hearts" from Felix Mendelssohn's oratorio Elijah, based on the depiction of Elijah in 1 Kings 18. In a recitative, Obadiah urges the Israelites to "return to God," and the reflective aria that follows provides ample opportunities for beautiful vocal sonorities and expression. With words by George Croly and music by Donald Hustad, DeVonté renders "Spirit of God Descend Upon My Heart," whose words appear in The Hymnal, at Communion. "When I Was Sinking Down" is a well-known American folk song that appears in a hymnal as early as 1835. Carl Haywood arranged this setting for tenor voice and organ, especially for this service and this tenor.
