Ecclesiastes 1:2, 12-14; 2:18-23



THE SECOND LESSON

Colossians 3:1-11

Is you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory. Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. But now you must get rid of all such things—anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!

THE NICENE CREED

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

Communion at Christ & St. Luke's:

- At the indication of the usher, please move to the center aisle and proceed up the altar rail. Move to the open spot filling in from the center of the rail to the wall.
- Kneel as you are able and place one hand over the other, palms up, to receive the bread.
- To sip from a chalice to receive the wine, consume the bread leaving your palms empty.
- To intinct (dip) your wafer into the wine, hold it between your thumb and forefinger.
- Once the chalices have passed, exit out the side and back down the side aisles to your pew.

Gluten free wafers are available, simply let the priest know you require one. If you prefer not to receive the bread or wine but would like a blessing, gently cross your arms across your chest.

A standing station is also available in front of the pulpit.

MUSIC NOTES:

Today we welcome organist Dr. Carl Haywood and vocalist Rachel Fillmore who are leading our worship today while our Choir and Pilgrims are in England at St. Paul's Cathedral in London. We thank them for their gifts of beautiful and inspiring music in our worship.

Rachel Filmore is a graduate of Norfolk State University and is currently pursuing a graduate degree in Vocal Performance at her undergraduate Alma Mater, as well. She performs frequently with the Virginia Opera and was recently featured in scenes from the opera Treemonisha (Scott Joplin) produced by Opera for Us. At the Offertory, she sings the dramatic aria "Hear ye, Israel!" which opens part II of Felix Mendelssohn's oratorio, Elijah. The aria summons the people of Israel to be not afraid and listen to what God "speaketh." At Communion, Rachel sings, "The Call," also known as Come, My Way, My Truth, My Life in most hymnals, from R. Vaughan Williams' Five Mystical Songs, with texts by the metaphysical poet, George Herbert (1593-1633). She concludes with the African American spiritual, "He's Got the Whole World in His Hand," a staple in the repertoire of Leontyne Price arranged by the prolific arranger Margaret Bonds, the first African American woman to perform with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra.

Dr. Haywood writes about his postlude "Come Sunday": As a child, I vividly remember my mother awakening my brother and me on Sunday morning and decrying, "Boys, it's time for church." With each passing minute, a joyful reality overwhelmed me. Yes, it was Sunday, my favorite day of the week! My excitement would heighten upon our arrival at church, as I witnessed hundreds of churchgoers dressed in their Sunday best create a beehive of activity before worship. Every corner, room, or hall had gatherings, meetings, rehearsals, or preparations culminating in the worship service. Ushers, choirs, deacons, trustees, hospitality corps, nurses, and, of course, the pastor contributed handsomely to make worshipping on Sunday a religious extravaganza not to be missed! "Come Sunday" fondly captures the joy and musical reflection of this wonderful day of my youth.
