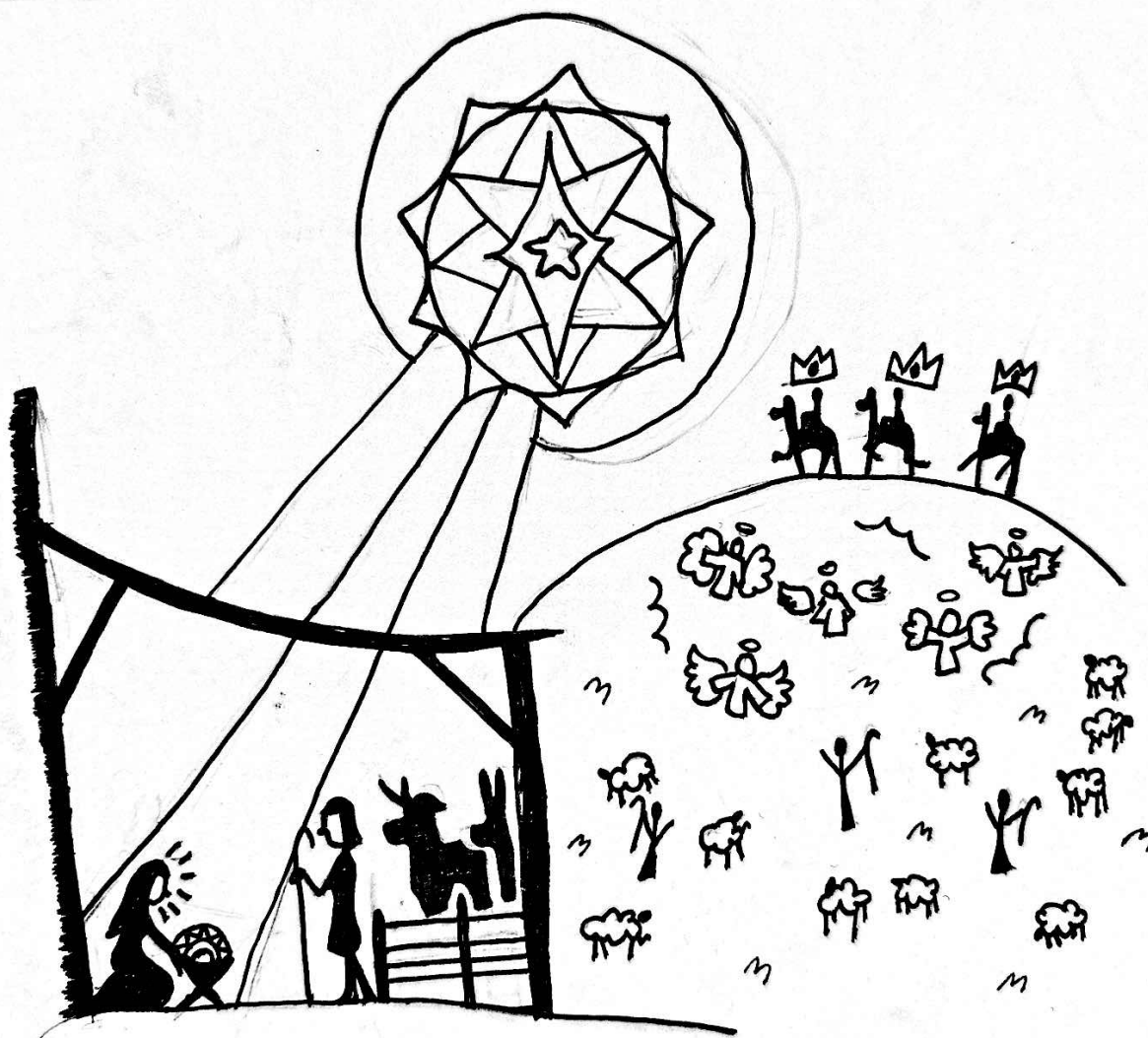

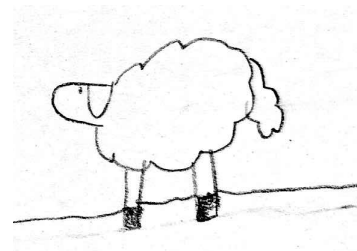
PRELUDE: Prelude on "Quem Pastores"

And he leads his children on to the place where he is gone.**

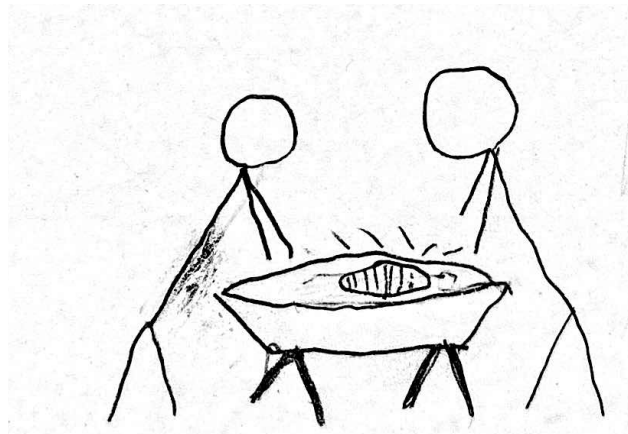
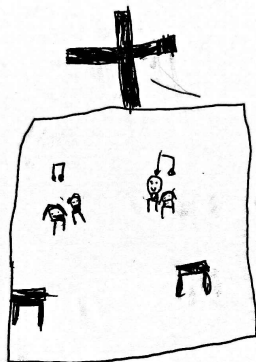
**4. Not in that poor, lowly stable with the oxen standing round,

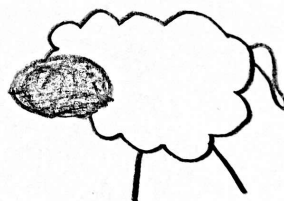
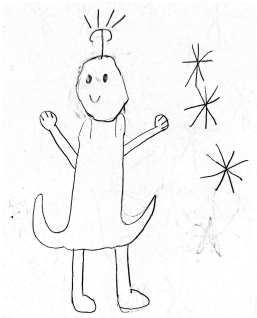
Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

And so, Father, we who have been redeemed by him, and made a new people by the coming of your Son, now bring before you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ our Lord.

On the night he was betrayed he took bread, said the blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to his friends, and said, "Take, eat: this is my Body, which is given for you. Fall on your knees, oh, hear the angel voices, O night divine, O night when Christ was born.

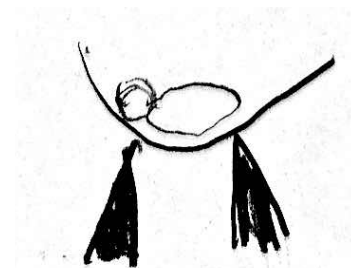
Led by the light of faith serenely beaming, with glowing hearts by His cradle we stand.

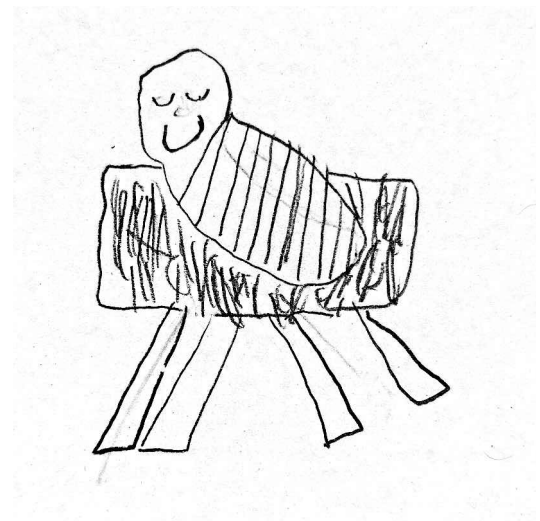

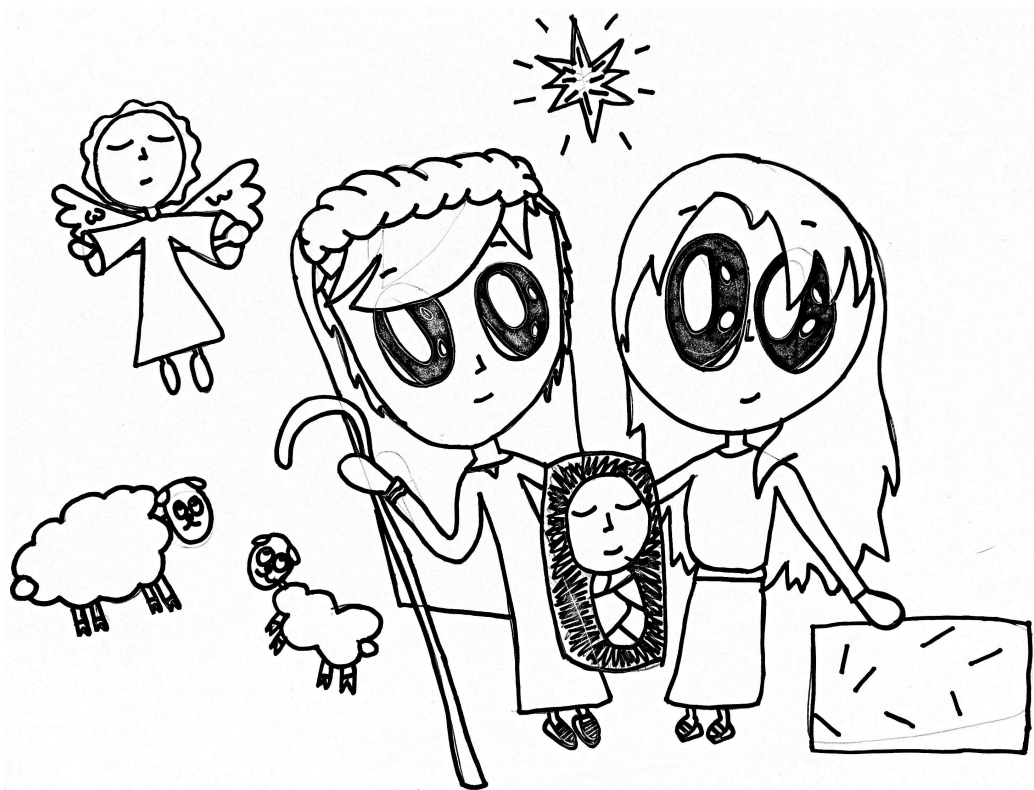
